Nesåsen

Previously, there were many ski hills in Lørenskog, both build up and others that were only laid out on a steep field or similar places. The following build up ski hills can be mentioned: Kirkerudkollen, Rudkollen, Nesåsen, Haneborgkollen and Hovelsrudhagen. These were slopes where jumping races were arranged with participation far beyond Lørenskog's borders.

Other slopes include Kjennbakken, Grankollen, Blåkollbakken, Hamarkollen, Røyribakken, Gryta, Masserudbakken, Liabakken

Common to these slopes was that they were all built on a voluntary basis.

You are now in the transition on the Nesåsen ski hill.

It was built by Lørenskog Ski Club in 1947 and was a hill with a hill record of 30 meters.

In 1954, the ground received floodlights, which were also installed on a voluntary basis. It was used a lot and every year a ski hill was arranged on the slopes.

During the 1960s, the hill was deteriorating and was not in operation for several years, but in 1976 the hill was rebuilt with a new style.

A new hill record was set in 1986 and was 37.5 meters

Due to many winters with little snow in the 80's, the hill was scarcely used, and together with vandalism, the hill had to be closed for safety reasons.

On March 10, 2016, the scaffolding was torn down by blasting.

If you look towards Losbyelva, you will see remnants of the bridge that was built to run across the river.
